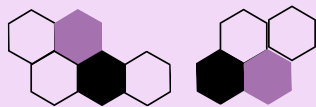


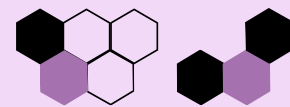
# EXPLORING STUDENT VOICE

Have students explore their voice in the classroom, school or local community!

This hexagon thinking activity provides a platform for students to **ask questions or wonderings** and share their **knowledge**.



## HOW IT WORKS



Start students off with a guiding question to write on their first question hexagon. From here, students can add in a new question and/or knowledge that connects to the initial idea.

**The aim** of the hexagons is to create a mindmap of **connecting ideas** and themes. Students can use words or images to display their thinking.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Print out multiple copies of the hexagon bee template (see next page) on two different coloured peices of paper, one for each of the following:

- Questions/wonderings I have
- What I already know (or knowledge I have)

In groups of three, share ideas, brainstorm and discuss a starting question centered on student voice.



Here are some ideas...

→ How is your voice heard? (in your classroom, school or community?)

→ How could your voice be stronger?  
→ Why is your voice important?
