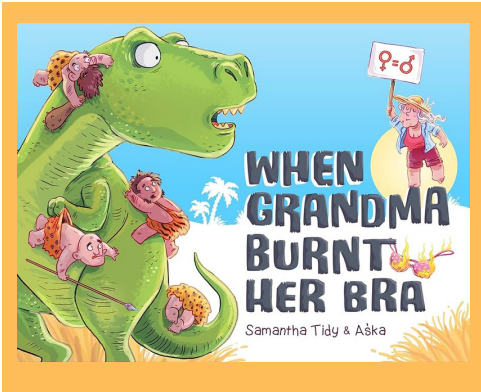




WHEN GRANDMA BURNT HER BRA

CONNECT

CATEGORISE

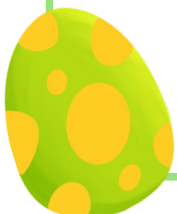


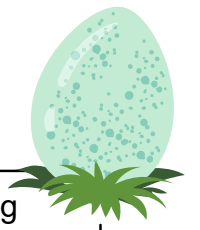

CONSIDER



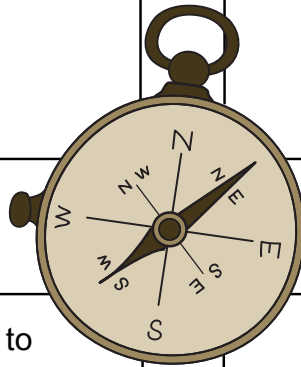
