


VOTE 4 ME

Curriculum Links: Literacy, Mathematics, HASS, Visual Arts


Age Range: Year 5/6

ACTIVITY: PERSUASIVE POWER

Students will critically reflect on the importance of voting in our democracy and use their **persuasive skills** to **encourage others to enrol to vote.**

- Read the text Vote 4 Me and **discuss the links** between Australia's voting system and the story.
- Visit the <u>Australian Electoral Commission</u> website. Unpack the enrolment data with students. Invite them to **make predictions** and **comment on the figures**. Encourage students to share reasons why people would not enrol to vote.
- In groups of three, students complete the planning sheet and **create an advertisement** encouraging people to enrol to vote. To stretch students' thinking incorporate research into this activity to strengthen their arguments.
- Have groups **share their advertisements** with the whole class. This could also make for a great window display.


Extension Activity: Have your students debate the positives and negatives of compulsory voting!





How can we encourage more people to enrol to vote?




What are **some of the reasons** why people would not enrol to vote?
