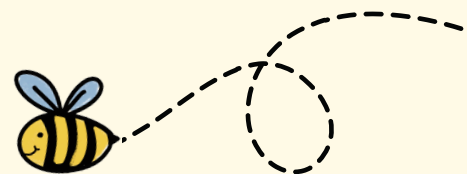


Invite students to view some of Sean's [incredible sculptures](#). Using recycled materials create a sculpture or artwork to invite conversations with others about the importance of bees.
