


*In 2020, at age 78, Joe Biden was the oldest person to be inaugurated US president. If successful, he would have been 82 when sworn in for a second term. After Biden eventually pulled out of the race, Trump, now 78 himself, became the oldest candidate ever to seek the office of president.*


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**Andrew Dyson**





*Throughout the year commentators speculated about when an election might be called. 




